Preparing for Registration

Encourage your students to...

- ✓ Submit ALL AP/IB scores (Code: 5187)
- ✓ Submit previous college transcripts and evaluation form
- ✓ Explore department websites
- ✓ Review track advising presentations (if applicable)
- ✓ Search the Course Atlas (reminder: use filters)
- ✓ Load up their Shopping Cart
- ✓ Consider many possible schedules
- ✓ Keep an open mind!





Registration Timeline

Enrollment Appointment		Add/Drop/Swap
August 8 12pm (noon) - 11:59pm EDT	August 9 @ 12pm (noon) - August 10 @ 11:59pm EDT	August 22-Sept 6
Enroll in up to 8 credits only	Register for remaining credits, up to 15-17 credits	All students (not just first- years) are updating schedules in “real time”
	Minimum: 12 credits Maximum: 19 credits	Registration is a process, not an event!

Prioritize based on interests and goals!

Everything counts toward
graduation.

Graduation Requirements

- Students will complete at least 126 credit hours to graduate including:
 - General Education Requirements (~43 credit hours)
 - One major (34-64 credit hours)
 - Elective Classes
 - Optional: secondary major (34-64 credits) or minor (16-36 credits)
- We want your students to explore!
- In fact, we do not allow students to declare their majors during their first semester.
- Students should aim for 15-17 credits per term to stay on track to graduate in 4 years.

Students can attend their classes and make adjustments as needed!

**Finalize your fall
schedule**

**Find a balance of
courses and credits**

**Aim for a range of
15-17 credits**

- 15-17 credits will keep your student on track to graduate in 4 years
- Allows your student to withdraw from a class and maintain the 12 hours required for full-time status
